*We're glad you've joined us as we gather to receive God's gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation. We don't gather because we're perfect. We gather because we're sinners who desperately need the forgiveness and new life Jesus won for us by His perfect life, death, and resurrection. As you prepare for the Divine Service today, you are invited to pray the prayers inside the front cover of your hymnal. As you prepare for Holy Communion, please read the communion statement on page 8.*

**A Note on the Offering:** *This Sunday, we continue our return to the practice of carrying the offering forward to the front of the sanctuary. All offerings that have been placed in the plates at the sanctuary doors will be carried forward after the sermon. Plates will still be available near the sanctuary doors for those who wish to offer their gifts to the Lord following the service.*

## Confession and Absolution

*Please rise and face the processional cross at the rear double doors. As the processional cross passes, you are invited to bow and make the sign of the cross (but you do not have to do so as a reminder 1.) of Christ's humiliation and death for us and 2.) of the fact that "at the name of Jesus every knee should bow in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:10b-11, ESV). The fact that this processional opens our service is a reminder of the centrality of Christ's death for all Christian worship and preaching ("For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified"- 1 Cor. 2:2, ESV).\**
