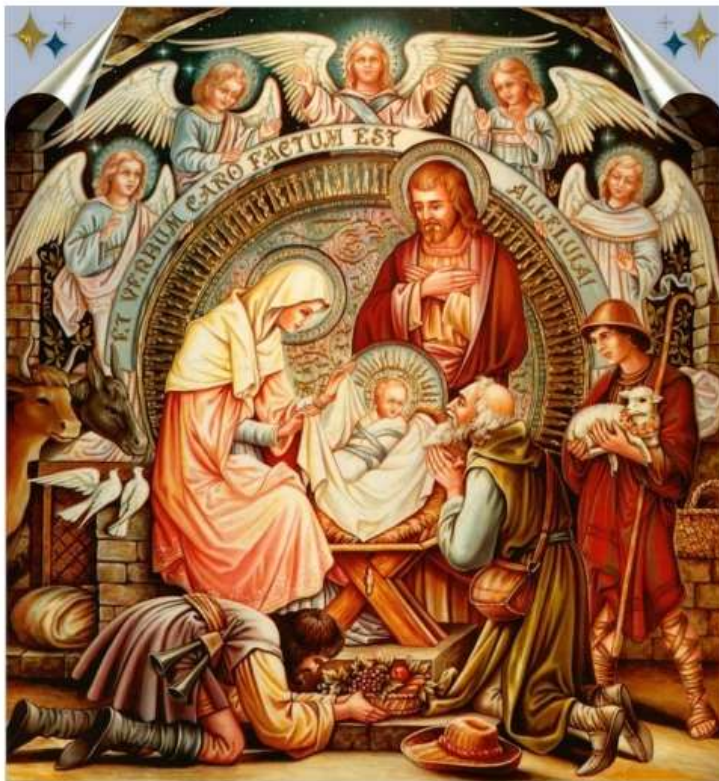

Confession and Absolution

*For the processional hymn, please rise and face the processional cross at the rear double doors. As the processional cross passes, all are welcome to bow and make the sign of the cross as a reminder of the fact that "at the name of Jesus every knee should bow in heaven and on earth and under the earth and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (see Philippians 2:5-11) The fact that this processional opens our service is a reminder of the centrality of Christ's death for all Christian worship and preaching ("For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified"- 1 Cor. 2:2, ESV).**

³⁴Then the cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle.

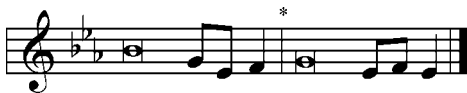

Service of the Sacrament

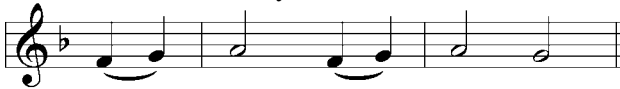

Out of love for those who commune, New Hope Lutheran Church communes only those who

1. Have been taught and examined in the Christian faith,
2. Confess their sins and trust in Christ for forgiveness,
3. Have made a public confession of their agreement with us in this one Scriptural faith through membership in this congregation or another congregation of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.
4. Have spoken with the pastor prior to the service.

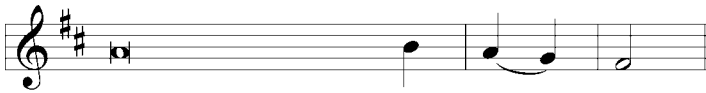
